The larger goals of service-learning are to educate citizens, prepare tomorrow's leaders, and contribute to the quality of life of America's communities through civic engagement. When service learning is prominent in campus culture it can help facilitate collaborations, sponsor programs, share best practices and promote higher education's role in graduating well-informed, engaged citizens.

Over the years, faculty at Purdue University Calumet have taught and facilitated several service learning courses. Recently, some faculty have launched further service learning initiatives as part of Purdue Calumet's new emphasis in experiential education.
